Closure of leaves and Lie groupoid structure: the proof of Molino's conjecture

In this talk we review the ideia of the proof of Molino's conjecture that for each singular Riemannian foliation (M, \mathcal{F}) , the partition $\overline{\mathcal{F}}$ given by the closures of the leaves of \mathcal{F} is again a singular Riemannian foliation. In addition, we discuss the semi-local models of Singular Riemannian foliations and stress the Lie groupoid structure of the associated subfoliation (the linearized subfoliation) that roughly speaking describe the semi-local dynamical behavior of \mathcal{F} . This talk is based on a joint work with Prof. M. Radeschi (Notre-Dame) [1] and other work with M. Inagaki and Prof. I. Struchiner (IME-USP) [2]. It is aimed at a broad audience of students, faculties and researchers in Geometry.
